Sermon Notes

Intro: In the long passage today, we will see the first martyr of the church era that we know of... a deacon named Stephen... and we will also meet the one who appears to have orchestrated his execution, Saul (who will become the Apostle Paul). The manner in which Stephen lived, and the power with which he died cries out to all the faithful followers of Jesus with a haunting challenge to prioritize Gospel over comfort; and Jesus over tradition... things which we often fear putting into practice.... Even in the relative safety of Christianity in the West.

1. Stephen's life is a powerful testimony to a living God... and Stephen used every moment to point to his Savior!

A. He became the dynamic force God would use to set the global mission movement into action!

Note: He was one of the few that we know of that held a "church office." But that did not define him... the commission to spread the Gospel did that...

B. The enemy will stop at nothing to halt the progress of the Gospel... which is why Jesus urged us to be constantly prepared and prayerful.

2. When Stephen was called on to explain his faith and actions... he was ready... are we? {This fellow never stops speaking against this holy place and against the law. ¹⁴ For we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place and change the customs Moses handed down to us."}

A. Stephen shared a crucial Christian doctrine we all should understand... He began with Abraham and demonstrated that all of history including the patriarchs, covenants and even the Temple, were pointing to and leading to God's Redeemer, salvation in Christ. (The reason Stephen answered in this fashion was due to the specific accusations against him.)

B. Stephen accused them of placing their hopes in buildings and traditions instead of the living God... vv. 48-50

3. Stephen died like he lived... full of confidence, grace, and power

A. The manner of Stephen's death had a tremendous impact on the church and the faith in general. We too are called to present our bodies as "living sacrifices" in Romans 12... but do we?

B. God provided Stephen sufficient grace to stand firm and overcome... and He will do the same for you.

Application points to consider...

- God is always maneuvering forward the glory and greatness of His Son.... Are you praying/preparing to meet God's activity with faith and Gospel, wherever He begins to work in your life?
- Are you ready for the battle that will ensue, when you begin to advance on the gates of hell?
- Do we sometimes settle for peripheral institutional tasks as cover to avoid our primary Kingdom task?

Pastor Search Committee

The Pastor Search Committee will hold a follow-up to the Town Hall meeting on Tuesday, Jan 20 at 5:45 pm in the FLC. We will have further discussion on topics from the meeting. If there are potential improvements we can make as a church, let's work on them before the next pastor arrives. Topics that have presented obstacles in the pastoral search:

1. Church identity, including dual alignment (SBC and CBF NC)
Who are we as a church? What is our vision? Who are the leaders of our church? Who do we go to for answers? What does the Bible say?
2. Constitutional changes
 - a. Monthly business meetings - Recommend Quarterly business meetings, maybe after church on Sunday
 - b. Committee-led church – condense committees? Move to Elder-led?
 - c. Article III (purposes) (E) less than 2-year employment restriction on constitution changes for Pastor or Assoc. Pastor
3. Budget - Pastors want to see this. Suggest tithe to the general fund and not designated funds. Trust the church to put money where it needs to go. Only have a few designated accounts for special items.

Additional topics brought to the Town Hall Meeting:

- a. Define who we are and know the direction of the church
- b. The HR committee to review the Senior Pastor job description
- c. Why must the Event form be signed by the pastor and the moderator?
- d. Need to focus on Outreach and Facility Use for Outreach
- e. Start Small Groups
- f. Look at voting age in the Constitution
- g. Committees' vs Teams
