Sermon Notes

Communion is an odd thing... we are celebrating a death... why? Because in this particular death there is really only life!

Mark records that at a crowded dinner party shortly before Jesus' death... it was an unlikely woman who understood what was at stake, what was about to happen on a cross, and she offered Jesus her gift and herself, broken and poured out.

1. It is impossible to receive the gift of Jesus' death if we have not been broken and emptied of our selves!
 - a. Some are convinced they don't really need a Savior, only a celebrity
 - b. Others are just going along for the "religious ride" to see where it leads
 - c. But in our text, there was at least one person who was broken, and ready to receive Jesus' actions on the cross.

Application thought: Could it be the reason we struggle with brokenness is that we are too proud or calloused to fully see/face our sin? Therefore, not adequately grateful for our sin's cure...

2. When we are broken... anything we are asked to pour out for Jesus seems worth it!
 - a. Jesus often encouraged would be followers to "count the cost."
 - b. Jesus compared the Kingdom of God to great but sometimes hidden treasure.
 - c. In communion we are reflecting on the cost for Jesus, but what is the cost for us?

Application: The contrast between the woman and Judas in this passage highlights the difference between one who follows Jesus hesitantly, half-heartedly, narcissistically... and one who follows Jesus as if their very life depended on it... as if their life drawn from His life... which of these two are you most resembling today?

3. When we are broken and poured out, the usual constraints and fears melt into the brilliant, bright person of the Son of God, Jesus!
 - a. Is it possible that she loved Jesus so much that she never really saw or heard any of the others in the room... can the call of the cross drown out the clatter of the crowd? Yes

Response: Lord, forgive us for offering you unbroken jars... full of us, full of pride. Whatever you ask us to pour out today, we acknowledge that you are more than worth it.

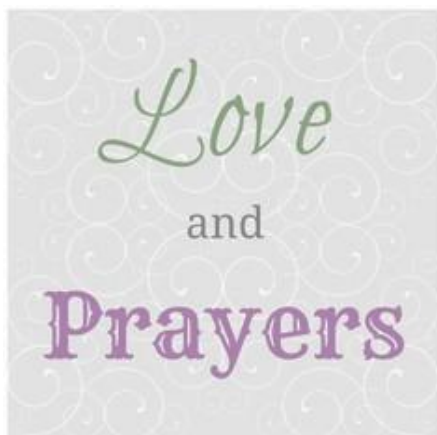

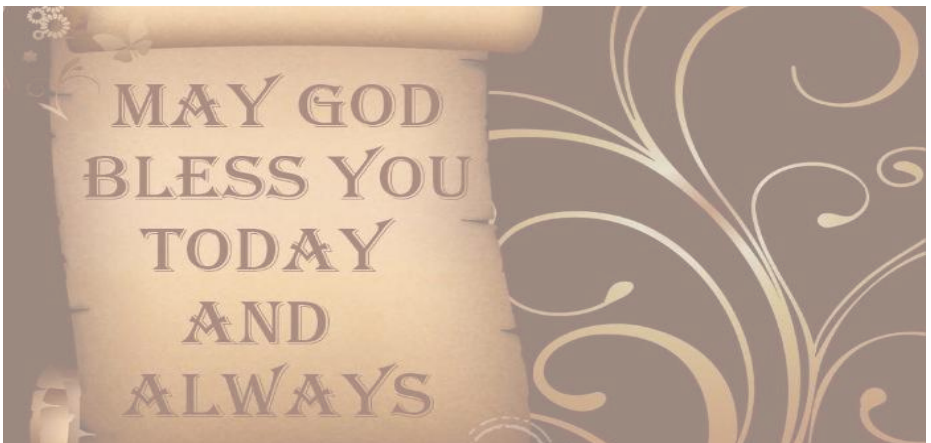
